"And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified" (Luke 2:8-9). A Message from Our Principal...

November has been a fun-filled month here at Peace Lutheran School with lots of different activities and highlights!

This month, our brand new Robotics Teams got to compete in their first competitions! We had two teams in our 4th and 5th grade LEGO Robotics division: the Mini Spiky Pantherbots and the Mini Coding Pantherbots. Each team built a robot out of LEGO and then programmed it to run tasks on its own. Both teams competed in four matches and improved each and every time. They also had to do a research project revolving around an innovation that could be used in the field of archeology. They

made a poster and presented their findings to a panel of experts. In the end, our Mini Coding Pantherbots finished 3rd of 36 teams! Way to go!

At the end of the month, our Middle School Pantherbots had their competition. This group had to build a robot that needed to move around a field and shoot plastic balls into a goal. They also had to do a research project and presentation that revolved around what they learned through this collaboration. The Middle School Pantherbots had five initial competitions where they were paired with another team to compete against a different pair. Each round, they improved and finished ranked 24th out of 35 teams. Overall, they did not advance to state, but made great progress for our first year. We are looking forward to seeing how far this program will go in the future.



We also have four complete JV basketball teams again. Our JV A boys and girls competed at Trinity Utica in a basketball tournament. The girls finished in 4th place and the boys were able to win 3rd place. Great job! The two boys' teams also competed in the Lutheran Northwest basketball tournament. Our B boys worked very hard and they were able to reach the Consolation Championship game and the A boys were able to finish in 4th place.



Additionally, we are also looking forward to our choir singing at the Historic Trinity Advent Service. Please pray for our students as they share the Gospel message through song with the people of Detroit.

We want to invite you to our Christmas Program on Wednesday, December 17. Our performances are at 10:00am, for our grandparents and anyone who does not wish to drive at night, and 6:30pm. This year's program is entitled "Arrest these Merry Gentlemen." Please come to see all of the amazing things our students are learning, and listen to them sing praises about the baby born in Bethlehem.

Finally, on behalf of the faculty and staff of the school, we want to wish everyone a Happy Advent and a Merry Christmas. As






Christmas Concert
