

God's Math Written by Beverly Porter

Humankind has always been driven by the concept of More. It begins at an early age. Just watch two toddlers surrounded by toys. If one child grabs one of the toys, the other toddler now desires the same one. Birthday parties are even more telling of the desire to accumulate. At most childhood parties, there are so many gifts to open, that each gift hardly gets any appreciation. The next gift quickly gets the child's attention. This takes place more often in homes where abundance is common.



The above descriptions of childhood craving for MORE are only a few examples that can prepare one for adulthood yearnings for more. The truly ambitious will sacrifice family, friends, and social life to gain status and wealth. Those who are "Risk -takers" will add such ventures as get rich quick schemes and gambling in their attempts to achieve MORE. Mankind's motto can be summed up in this equation::

Zero + Hard Work (or other creative measures) = MORE However at death, the equation changes: More + Death = 0 Man begins with nothing and ends with nothing.

God has His own math. It began at creation. He spoke a few words, "Let there be..." and the universe came into being. The few resulted in Many. Jesus chose twelve uneducated Jewish men and created His Church, which includes believers from every tribe, nation and tongue. A few loaves of bread and fewer fish fed thousands. God uses little to create much. Man uses more to get more. Two of the best examples that illustrate the principle of using little to result in abundance, are the alphabet and the musical scale. Our alphabet has 26 letters. Out of just over two dozen characters, countless books have been written ranging from a simple child's nursery rhyme to the technical medical journals that only the trained can understand or enjoy reading. The Bible, regardless of the language it is written in, uses a specific, unchanging set of letters to record God's life giving words.

The second example of God's math is equally amazing, Eight notes, although it brings variation by the addition of sharps and flats, highs and lows, the same notes remain the same. Twinkle Twinkle Little Star and Handel's Messiah are quite different in complexity, but not in the number of notes it has at its disposal.

As in the case of man's math, God's math also takes a drastic turn - but for the better! In order to restore man, God changes the equation. He starts with man's many sins and reduces it to Zero with the Blood of His Son. Man's sins are no more, but man does not stay at zero - he gains Eternal Life! In the case of an unrepentant man, his life equation also ends with zero. But that number reflects his quality of his life and impending eternal damnation. His sins are not reduced without sincere repentance.

In summary, man has to achieve more to get more, for his goal is More. God, on the other hand, does not need Much to accomplish Much. What Math is being used in your life?
