






Easter Breakfast Youth Fundraiser

THE WONDER OF TRANSFER

Have you ever seen a picture of an image transferred from one piece of paper to another? We have the magic medium called transfer paper, and I use it when I want to transfer a picture I have drawn to a better piece of paper. The original drawing is flawed with erasure smudges and to be able to transfer the original to another clean surface saves me hours of work.

Transfer has other uses as well. We use it in airports when we transfer from one flight to another. Our transfer has been purchased with the original ticket. This ticket, later on in the flight, will get us transferred

to the plane that will reach our destination. The concept of transfer is in place when an employee is transferred by the company to another office in a different location, often out of state. This transfer might cause upheaval to the employee, but a solution to the employer. Transfer ... it has its pros and cons.

I have thought of another wonderful act of transfer. We are encouraged to walk with our Lord throughout the day, to stay close to Him lest we stray. Sweet fellowship is the tether that keeps me connected to a source of wisdom much greater than my own. But why would a flawless Savior want to be my close companion? I have accumulated the dross of the world by my thoughts and actions, which would contaminate His purity. I, myself, do not want anything or anyone grossly unkempt to be close to me when I am clean and presentable. It not only makes me look careless in choosing my companions, but his filth might rub off on me. Why would Jesus want to experience such contamination?

I think I have answered my question when I ponder why He came to this earth. He came as a holy and pure baby only to grow up and mingle with unclean, sinful humankind. His purpose was not to be untouchable and inaccessible. To be willing to rub shoulders with us, He had to be available to absorb our daily accumulation of sin. Yes, we were cleansed at the cross, but we live in an evil and self-centered world and much of its unrighteousness gets transferred to us. Transfer: here it is again. As I walk with Jesus, my uncleanness is transferred to Him. He daily absorbs my filthy layers of sin and makes me clean again. His is my TRANSFER, the one who makes me presentable to the Father and to the people He has given me to introduce to their TRANSFER.
